Preacher's Porch



I met an interesting person yesterday. Let's call him Matt. The story unfolded something like this. I had returned home and had put the roast in the oven to cook. Knowing that it would be a while before Tina and the kids were home, I decided to go for a run with our dog Max. As I approached the overpass, I noticed a broken down vehicle sitting in front of Four Stars with a lone man occupying it. By occupying I mean the hood was up and tools were out but the man (Matt) was actually at the back of the vehicle taking care of his old dog.

I noted that Matt was a clean-cut, youthful man in great physical condition, his car (an older Toyota Land Cruiser) was beautiful, his dog was well mannered, and the bicycle he had on back was a well-worn road bike that spoke of many miles of pedaling. Putting these things together, it gave me the confidence to stop by and see if there was anything I could do to help. As it turned out, there was. But in the process, I found out that Matt was an off duty officer who was on his way home to Houston to see his dad who had suffered a stroke last year and is having failing health. He was taking the old Land Cruiser because his dad loves it and he was trying to give him one last ride in the car before it was too late.

With all of this as a back story, we (Tina made it home by then) were able to help Matt get to Wichita Falls where he rented a U-Haul and car carrier to finish his trip. Meanwhile Spinnaker (his old dog) had a safe place to stretch since we pulled his car to our house instead of letting it sit on the side of the road while he was gone.

Now this is not to pat myself on the back...I really did very little. But it is to consider something. Did you notice I qualified my appraisal? I noted the appearance of his vehicle, his cleanliness, his bicycle, tools and his dog. These physical attributes told me that this person was probably someone who takes care of things, works hard, and has some compassion and so I felt like he was worthy of my time and effort. And that points out that had it been an old, beat-up junk mobile, had he been long-haired, tattooed, smelling like smoke, holding a sign or even just dirty, I probably would have passed him up judging that he is either possibly dangerous or not worth my time (I am not mechanically inclined and it looks like he can handle it, right?).

And that begs the question, "Is that a picture of my 'religiosity'?" Do I judge the "worthiness" of people based on their appearance; on my comfort level with them, on their work ethic? Or do I use the standard that Christ did...all have sinned and are therefore unworthy (including me)?

You see, when we pre-judge on physical matters it shows good sense. But when we pre-judge on spiritual matters, we are doing the exact opposite of what Christ told us to do when he said, "18-20 Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age." (Matthew 28 in the Message). In Acts, we see Peter's vision of "clean" and "unclean" describing gentile people (us). If someone hadn't taken a chance, we would not be here today.
