Preacher's Porch

I know that this revelation may seem obvious to some of you, but to me it really was a revelation. Did you know that there are some people that just like to argue? And it really doesn't seem to matter to them whether they are right or wrong; they just want to be in the middle of or causing some type of controversy, complaint, problem, etc. Every time.

Now, let me tell you when I came to this realization. It was in the middle of a baseball game and I wasn't even umpiring. At one point in the game, the home plate umpire made a rather unusual call that went against the visiting team. Batter interference caused the batter to be called out and the base runner to go back to first base. Now, as you would expect, the visiting team coach came out and visited with the umpire who made the call and, after an explanation, returned to the team area. Everything was good (or so it seemed). But here's the weird part...during the half-inning break, the home team coach (who has a reputation for such things) came out and started an argument with the umpire who had made the call. He wasn't arguing that it was the wrong call. He wasn't arguing that it was the wrong assessment. He was arguing that the umpire should have made the same call earlier in the game at a different point (and different circumstance) and demanded to know why it wasn't called then.

What I am saying is this, by that point, any call made previously could not have been changed. He had been the recipient of a controversial judgment call that had helped his team and everyone else had already forgotten the other non-incident (which was never in question at the time it happened). In other words, it was a useless argument to make and served absolutely no purpose except to try to show the umpire who was boss...to intimidate.

As they stood belly to belly (literally, I have pictures) I could not help but be reminded of what the Bible says in Titus 3:9-10^{"9} But avoid foolish controversies and genealogies and arguments and guarrels about the law, because these are unprofitable and useless. ¹⁰ Warn a divisive person once, and then warn them a second time. After that, have nothing to do with them." continued inside..


