I love reading Christian writings. I enjoy browsing through Amazon, finding a book that piques my interest, learning from people far wiser and more experienced than myself. I love reading books that challenge me, push me, and make me think. I'm kind of addicted to learning spiritual truths.

But lately there's something about Christian writings that has really bugged me.

It's that everyone has the answer.

Almost every Christian book out there is about someone who has arrived, someone who has figured it all out. Many Christian books' premise are, "We've found the secret to marriage, church growth, wealth, prayer, etc. and if you would just follow this principle everything will work out." Christian blog posts are often the same, entitled "Here are the 10 ways to

_____" with the assumption that if you only knew these things, everything would be alright. What I miss, and what I wish was more normal, is struggle. Honest, raw, Christ-filled struggle. I don't mean abandonment of faith, or bitterness, or crying for attention. But why don't we spend more time asking hard questions? And why do Christians seem so afraid of questions?

For many people, it took discovery to become a Christian. You asked hard questions, you wrestled, you wondered, you had long convers ations with people. And it took time. But, eventually, you placed trust in Christ. At least that's what happened with me. And though I've trusted in Christ for 11 years now, I still ask questions, I still struggle. Life is still hard, and sometimes the answer isn't clear, no matter what the books say. And even though I've been in full-time church ministry for most of my Christian journey, it doesn't mean that I stopped asking questions. I'm not impervious to the pains of life.

I think we love happy endings. We long for everything to work out in the end. And I believe that one day all things will be made right when Christ comes again. But if we're honest, life here doesn't always work that way. You can't always wrap up everything up in a 30 minute TV show, finding out who the bad guy is and getting justice, then moving on to the next show. Sometimes the good guys don't win, sometimes everything doesn't make sense. God is open about this in the Bible. The book of Jonah ends with a prophet of God wishing punishment on a nation God wanted to forgive. There's no repentance on his part. It just ends. Job loses his children, and at the end of the story he doesn't get them back. Judas betrays Jesus, and he doesn't see the error of his way. No, he's so filled with guilt that he takes his own life. Sometimes life is ugly, it's raw, it's confusing, and it's messy. And the Bible doesn't shy away from this.

So why are we so afraid of this? It's almost as if we're afraid that if we ask a question, if we really start to wonder, the whole thing will come crashing down. One of the things people crave above all else is security. We want to feel that the ground beneath us is solid, that things are the same and we can rest in peace that our reality is firm.

But how can we possibly hope to engage a world which doesn't believe in Christ if we refuse to ask questions? I love speaking with people who aren't Christians on matters of faith, not because I have all the answers, but because I've asked the same questions. Sometimes, maybe even most of the time, the conversation ends and I have no compelling answer for them. I can only speak as to how Christ made things click for me. But I helped them along the journey.

Do we have space for exploration, for discovery, for honesty, for struggle? The Bible is not a book with God saying, "Here I am, and I made a book which answers all your questions." No, it's a book about God, a loving Creator which made creatures that rebelled against Him, things got messy, and He makes things right in Jesus. It's a story, and the story is still going. It isn't finished. It's okay to wrestle.
