
Preacher's Porch

I enjoy reading. I enjoy reading almost anything; but my favorites are Luis L'amour and the daily comics. Much to my chagrin, Mr. L'amour passed away several years ago. But much to my delight, the daily comics keep on coming and I can even peruse them on my computer on a daily basis. I don't, but I can.

During one recent day, it came to my attention that many, many of the comics; probably a majority of the comics are based on the personification of animals rather than simply using humans.
