
Preacher's Porch

As busy as my family is, one of the things that I look forward to with great zeal is a time to just have family time. Normally, we have practice for one sport or another on Monday, games on Tuesday, church of Wednesday, etc., and so, it is a rare and precious thing when we get to simply be together without the pressure of a forced, scheduled activity; to build our relationship with one another, get to know each other, and catch up on what is going on. That brings me to last week.

On Sunday, we traveled to El Reno, Oklahoma for my grandmother's funeral on Monday. From El Reno, after getting everything set up and in place (projector, songs, etc.) we drove on up to Stillwater with my parents to spend the night and then on Monday, we simply reversed the order. Tina was working on lesson plans and grading papers and I, well, I was driving. What that meant was, even though we were in close proximity to each other, we were not together. Not for more than a moment or two anyway. While it is true there was less arguing, less "are we there yet" attitude, these devices of convenience had isolated us within our togetherness.

I often wonder if that is how it is when we come together as a fellowship of believers. You see, God's plan is that we be together, that we interact, that we love one another deeply with genuine affection and yet in our busy society, I often notice that our only interactions seem to be superficial, surface interactions.
