First, let me say that I am borrowing from an article written by Carey Kinsolving. Second, let me say that I am trying to get you to think about stepping up and becoming a teacher. While we have many talented people here, it seems that we have lost a few teachers over the last few years and have not had many people step in to take their place and so, the folks who are teaching are getting used over and over and over again.

What difference can a teacher make?

I'm sure all of us can remember our favorite teachers in school; those who take a special interest in the kids, who motivate, who direct, who instruct, who impact, who make a difference. For me, it was a teacher who took a kid that received more than 100 swats in one year to one that became student council president. All by noticing that I was in trouble largely because I was bored in class and so was finding ways to entertain myself. So, Mr. Scroggins gave me the normal work plus my own extra assignments that only I did.

The Bible tells us, "Joash did what was right in the eyes of the LORD all the years Jehoiada the priest instructed him." (2 Kings 12:2). And this at a time when the nation was slipping into apostacy, putting up false gods; idols, etc. The difference in this seven year old boy king was his teacher.

Psalms, Proverbs and other places in the Bible tell us that "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools[c] despise wisdom and instruction." It continues in other places that wisdom is worth everything; to sell all you possess to gain it. Therefore, this idea of teaching fear of the Lord as the most important thing that can be done is highlighted. And it can be done in unconventional ways by unconventional people.

Jesus, for example, was the master teacher. He taught in ways that were "in the face" of the people of his time.
