You have often heard me bemoan the state of sports and, in particular, youth sports and the way in which we rob them of their original designed intent when we make it all about winning. So now, let me tell you about a different team.

The Iowa Park East Top-of-Texas football team has become one of my favorite teams of all times to call. Now, to be sure, they are certainly about wanting to win, but more importantly, they are about the business of keeping perspective and helping the kids have fun. And this attitude shows through in the effort and attitude of the players on both the third and fourth grade team as well as the fifth and sixth grade team.

A few weeks ago, I got to go to the new stadium in Iowa Park to call a set of these games.
