Preacher's Porch

Silent Night; Holy night; All is calm, all is bright, Round yon virgin mother and child, Holy infant so tender and mild, sleep in heavenly peace, sleep in heavenly peace. Such are the lyrics of one of my own personal favorite Christmas carols. But there is a problem in this. That is, it frames the way in which we see Christ and what it takes to understand him.

It works like this: when we see the arrival of Christ in this picture-perfect, postcard moment, the picture we get is one where everyone and everything is peacefully, perfectly, restfully waiting on the arrival of Christ and is just as peaceful, perfect and restful after His coming...even to the point of being reverently worshipful; that's the expectation we begin to build for those seeking Him. When we see Mary on her knees wearing a Mona Lisa smile, hands folded, gazing lovingly down into the manger as the cow chews its cud while laying near by with the donkey (and camels?) in the background it taints our image of Christ, no matter how idealistic.

You see, when Christ was born, it was an average, ordinary night. His earthly parents had been pressed by law into traveling while Mary was very, very pregnant. They were in town on government orders with no place to stay. The manger stank and undoubtedly had manure and other odors in it. Mary didn't have a miraculously easy delivery. The wise men weren't waiting outside with gifts to bestow on the king, in fact, the government tried to kill him when they learned of the Magi's reason for coming.

And this is an important distinction. It is important because we need to see, to know and understand that Christ came into the world not because it is idealistic, but because it is imperfect. He came for the struggling, the weak, and the unrighteous. He came precisely because the world had no room for Him as creator God and so needed the thing only He could provide...a Savior. He came for the ordinary; not the extraordinary. He came to provide a ransom for me. And for you. And He didn't wait until we were perfect, peaceful, calm and ideal. He came in the hour of need. No wonder they call Him Immanuel, God with us. Savior. King. Jesus. In Him, Todd
