As many of you know, I recently had to spend some time in the hospital due to an infection in my foot and leg that I picked up while traveling. Now, truth be told, I didn't think much of it and was fully willing to simply let my body fight it off once I got back home and into a regular schedule, but my wife had other ideas. We disagreed over the course of Saturday and Sunday and I had to admit, it wasn't getting any better on its own. Finally on Monday, I agreed to call the doctor and if they could get me in, I would go.

Doctor after doctor that we called said they could not see me. The problem was that I had been too healthy and had not seen a doctor since Doctor Parkey retired. Because of this, I was regarded as a new patient and nobody wanted a new patient; at least not in the time available that day and so I was content to say, "See, I told you so."

Tina, however, was not nearly so content. She kept insisting I do something and so we finally struck an agreement. We would call Dr. Schaffner (Retired) and ask him if he thought it was anything important. Whatever he said would go. And so we called Joan who called LeRoy who drove in from the farm, looked at my foot and leg and promptly said, "You need to go in today. Call the doctor and tell them I told you that you need to be seen today so that they don't put you off."

As much as I hate to admit it, this pretty well scared me, so after making a few more calls with similar results, I made my way to the emergency room where I was promptly admitted and put on some strong IV antibiotics. I also had some oral antibiotics, a couple of follow-up visits, orders to stay off my feet with my leg propped up, orders to stay out of the sun (sensitivity due to medicine), and, a biopsy on a strange spot on my other leg. WOW!


Did I like it? Not even a little bit. Have I followed the doctor's orders? As close as I possibly can. Why? Because I want to get better quickly and get back about my regular business. (I still have to do a few things so you may see me wearing shorts in the office or flip-flops during the work week for a while).

But did you catch what happened? I was sick. Very realistically, it could have been life-threatening had I not received care, and yet I refused to admit or even believe that I had a problem. I struggled to admit that I needed help and that I could not do it myself. Fortunately, I had others looking out for my best interest who insisted I go to the doctor. And that is just what the idea of church is about.

You see, we all have issues that we need help with. Yes, of course we need a savior from sin, but I am talking about more than that. There are times that I struggle with my actions, my attitude, my faith. I would be willing to bet that the same is true for you. Somehow, I think that I should be able to handle these situation myself (I don't need a doctor) and I even get upset at people who point out, call up, or dwell on my weaknesses. And many, many people claim that they don't need to come to church to be religious. BUT WE DO! That is why God designed the church. Together we can not only build up, encourage and support; but we can also promote healing, discover disease, and call to account. We can even help get the right spiritual attention when someone is sick, hurt, dying. But not if we isolate ourselves or refuse to listen to our (church) family.

Next time you are tempted to skip church, remember: together we are strong. Alone we are susceptible. We are a target. We will fail. Come to church. We need you. You need us. Together, we are the family of God.
