It absolutely broke my heart. There is no other way to say it; it was disappointment even though I knew it was the normal order of things and just the way that it is "supposed" to go. That still did not take the sting away.

Here's what happened: Tina and Michelle were gone to Lubbock while Robert was in Stillwater; all visiting family. That meant that Amelia, Greg and I were at home and living large. Now, as luck would have it, my oldest daughter is quite the social butterfly and really lives for the peer interaction she gets from work, sports, etc., so it should have come as no surprise to me that while we were at the mall Tuesday evening for an evening out, Amelia received an invitation to a movie with one of her female friends from work. She never even batted an eye considering that the reason we were there was to spend time together before pleading to go watch this movie that "I really want to go see."

I acquiesced and she went about her socializing while Greg and I went to make some hospital visits, and do other things. On the way home I told Amelia that I enjoy spending time with her and asked her to schedule some time we could just hang out. Between her work schedule and mine, it was decided that Saturday, after she got off work (3:30-4:00), we would hang out and go look at cars for her (which is the reason she got the job to begin with) even though she cannot afford one at this point. It was more about spending time together, doing something enjoyable in a neutral setting.

Wednesdays are amazingly busy for me. Thursday we both had work at opposite times and Friday, she went to hang out at the park with a particular young man after she got home from work. It was after she came in about curfew (8:00 p.m.) that she excitedly told me about a big get-together that a lot of them from work were planning here in Henrietta after work on Saturday. There were all these people coming and...Well. You know the rest. She never thought about spending time with me; I am always there.

And so Saturday came. As I took her to work, I guess I didn't really speak (although I didn't realize it) or maybe was just mopey because after I had dropped her off at work, I got a text from her, "Hope u have (a) better day." I sent back a note explaining that I was just feeling left out of her life; that she was important to me and that I had been looking forward to spending time together all week.

That's when it hit me. As children of God, we often do this to our Father. You see, He loves us and is eagerly seeking a relationship with us. He sets aside a part of each week to meet with us and spend time with us. The Bible even pictures him as a father eagerly, earnestly looking for our return. How often do we go and do what is calling at this moment instead of spending time with God because He is "always there?"
