Parents of small children, STOP! Don't let your kids read this! There was your, "I told you so."

We have all heard that, "It is more blessed to give than receive," and other such axioms that remind us of the joy of giving. But I wonder sometimes just how joyful it is when others get credit for our work.

Here's what I mean: As a parent, I have spent many Christmas eves waiting up until long after the last toddler has gone to bed in hopes that Saint Nicholas soon would be there so that I could put together, set up, assemble, wrap, or any other number of chores to prepare for Christmas morning. And I have spent an equal number of Christmas mornings with a mixed feeling of joy for the blessings we have that I was able to supply so many surprises to my kids and bewildered amusement wondering when my kids would realize the source of these treasures and then think to simply acknowledge the giver of the gifts. And while it is a wonderful feeling this watching the magic of Christmas unfold, there are honestly times that I would like to...to receive even a small dose of recognition.

That then causes me to ponder one of the great mysteries of the ages: have you ever noticed how many coincidences happen when you start praying? Now, I know what you are thinking right now, but let me expand on this thought with an example.

Yesterday I was returning home from my trip to see my parents in Stillwater, Oklahoma. Fortunately, he was watching out for me. Evidently, there were two white Suburbans in a row and I had seen the second one in the mirror while the lead vehicle was in my blind spot. But it turned out okay with the driver even giving me a friendly wave as he came alongside a few minutes later (really, no sarcasm here.)

Now many people would chalk that up to luck, circumstance, coincidence, karma or whatever. But isn't it funny that I had heard my parents pray for a safe trip home for myself, for Robert and for the rest of my family (coming from Lubbock). And is it coincidental that, despite my driving error, we all did have a safe trip? Or maybe it wasn't coincidence at all. Maybe it was an answered prayer.
