Have you ever been in a pit? I'm talking about the kind of quagmire that pulls you down, sticks to you, stinks, and makes it nearly impossible to escape.

When Tina and I were first married, I worked commercial construction as a plain ol', ditch-digging, jack-hammer-running laborer. We were remodeling and constructing hangers at the American Airlines maintenance facility in Tulsa. While the work was laborious, the pay was decent and our needs were few at that time.

During that job, I did everything that no one else wanted to do because it was too hard, too dirty, etc. and so it was that, on many occasions, I found myself in pits of one type or another. Sometimes it was below the surface of the tarmac in a tiny pit that was shorter than I was forcing me to have back bent and legs flexed as I ran my jackhammer into the side wall to build a connecting drain. Other times it was even worse. On one occasion I found myself in a rather nice pit where I was asked to start digging down to a particular level. The problem was, the excavator had been forced off the job because of chemical fumes which they were worried might be jet fuel seepage so. I had to use a shovel and wheelbarrow. As I dug, I didn't notice that my feet were slowly sinking into the soupy mixture below me to the point that, when I tried to leave to empty my wheelbarrow, I was stuck. In fact, I was stuck so tightly that I dislocated a hip trying to pull free. With no one else about (remember the fumes), I almost panicked. But this is a set-up for a different dav.

The point is, there are physical pits but there are also spiritual ones. Joseph, Daniel, David and other Biblical characters all found themselves in a pit. They come in all shapes and sizes.
