"He was a good man", she said. "He was generous, compassionate,  
and filled with love for his family and his friends." I asked, "Where  
did he attend worship?" "Oh, he never belonged or went to a  
church service, he was just a good man."

Nicodemus was a good man. He was a member of the Jewish  
council of elders, he sought to learn from Jesus, and he wanted to  
understand what the new birth was all about. As a matter of fact,  
he practiced the Jewish religion with zeal. Nicodemus was a  
religious man, but he wasn't a righteous man. So Jesus taught him  
one night about the new birth; a birth of water and spirit; a birth to  
get him into a right relationship with God.

There are many religious people in our world. They are generous,  
well mannered, upright, polite, and friendly. But they never darken  
the door where the congregation gathers to worship. Some folks  
have the idea that all their goodness will count for something when  
they stand before God in the judgment. They think that doing good  
will be enough to get them into heaven; sadly, it won't. Some folks  
believe that not doing harm will be enough to get them through  
the pearly gates; sadly, it won't. Some folks think that they can de-  
cide for themselves what it takes in life to be acceptable to God. It  
is not a human's decision to make.

Jesus taught us that he is the "way, the truth, the life, and no one  
comes to the Father except through him." (John 14:6). God is the  
covenant maker and humans are given the privilege to accept that  
covenant, reject that covenant, but humans cannot change it. It is  
God's way or not. We choose to humbly accept his covenant and  
live by it; that is, if we want to go to heaven.
